



Sliding Scale for Annual Membership Dues

A sliding scale for reduced dues based upon total annual organizational financial revenue is available for organizations with limited financial resources:

<u>Annual Organizational Financial Revenue (US\$)</u>	<u>Annual Dues (US\$)</u>
\$0 - \$99,999	\$500
\$100,000 - \$199,999	\$1,000
\$200,000 - \$299,999	\$1,500
\$300,000 - \$399,999	\$2,000
\$400,000 - \$499,999	\$2,500
\$500,000 - \$599,999	\$3,000
\$600,000 - \$699,999	\$3,500
\$700,000 - \$799,999	\$4,000
\$800,000 - \$899,999	\$4,500
\$900,000 - \$999,999	\$5,000
\$1,000,000 and above	\$5,500

Sliding scale eligibility must be confirmed by the organization's most recent publicly available financial report or government report, and renewed annually.

Location: Members which are **incorporated, headquartered, and operating in low or middle income countries** (LMICs) (as defined by the World Bank) **pay one-half the dues** otherwise determined from the basic annual dues and (if applicable) the sliding scale shown above. (That is, for example, a member incorporated, headquartered, and operating in an LMIC, with annual financial revenues of US\$350,000, would pay annual dues of \$1,000 (half of \$2,000).)
